

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

What happens if I am not happy with my results?

If the results achieved are not what was hoped for, Ofqual have stated that “students who feel that their grades from the summer do not reflect their ability will have the opportunity to take exams in the autumn series or summer 2021. If they choose to do this, students will be able to use the higher of the two grades for future progression.”

What happens if I do not collect my results on Results Day?

Please be aware that due to the unique situation we are in, only the student will be able to collect results. If you do not collect results they will be posted to the home address we hold on our system.

Can I re-sit my GCSEs?

We are hopeful that the majority of you will be pleased with the grades that you are awarded. However, we also understand that some of you may be disappointed and believe that you could have achieved higher grades if you had sat your examinations. The Government have confirmed that a full set of GCSE examinations will be available to students in the autumn. These will take place in November 2020. Further details on this will follow.

Can I appeal my results?

The Government have also updated their guidance on the appeals process for 2020 results. It states that “appeals should be allowed where a Centre (school) believes it has made an error when submitting its information; or similarly, if the Centre believes an exam board made a mistake when calculating, assigning or communicating a grade.” Please be assured that we will check all grades carefully against the grades that were submitted.

What happens if I do not get the results in need to move onto my chosen place of further education?

Most further education providers, including Stanground Sixth Form, will take into account the student’s full history and ability and will endeavour to get students onto the courses they wish to study.
